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Haveley Hey Curriculum Statement for Modern Foreign Languages (Spanish)

Modern Foreign Languages are a means of communication and a key skill to hold in this forever growing world. At Haveley Hey, having a highquality Spanish curriculum means that our children are more aware of other countries which offers an opening to other cultures. It builds an understanding and tolerance of the wider world and bridges the gap between our school and others on the other side of the world. In Haveley Hey, we understand that we all have a right to our own culture and customs, and that language is a large part of this. We aim to promote a curiosity in our children through learning a different language, aiming to create caring citizens that understand the world around them. We enable our children to express their ideas and thoughts in another language and to understand and respond to its speakers also. Our intent is to enhance language skills and encourage children to build a foundation for further learning of language and skills involved.

Curriculum We use the National Curriculum as a starting point, but enhance this for our own context by providing tailored, high-quality lessons to the children in Haveley. All lessons build on the rights of the child. We teach children to speak with fluency, increased confidence and spontaneity in Spanish.
